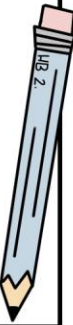

We are looking forward to welcoming back Jo Jingles and Luke from Sportstopia. This month we will also have a special visit from Wee Critters.

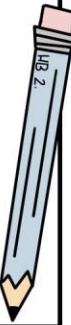


Areas of Learning

The Arts

We will be encouraging the children to:

- Develop their creativity and imaginative skills by creating birds, binoculars and bird houses
- Use a range of techniques to shape and change paper and card e.g. tearing, crumpling and layering



Early Mathematical Experiences

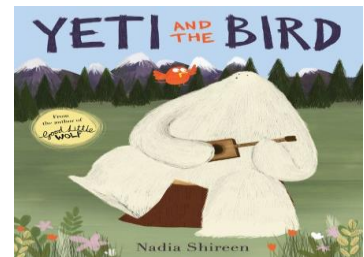
We will be encouraging the children to:

- Recite numbers in order to 10, through number songs, stories and rhymes
- Continue to develop their counting skills e.g. how many eggs does the bird have? how many worms can you count?
- Build nests and discuss the properties of different building materials
- Sort by colour, size and shape

Language Development

We will be encouraging the children to:

- Discuss what they already know about birds
- Use associated language to describe birds such as smooth and fluffy
- Talk about their creations and artwork
- Retell stories such as Owl Babies and Yeti and the Bird



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be encouraging the children to:

- Persevere with the task of building e.g. a nest/ a bird house
- Listen to and respond to instructions

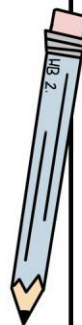


Areas of Learning

Physical Development and Movement

We will be encouraging the children to:

- Develop hand eye co-ordination when filling and pouring water and sand
- Develop fine motor skills by rolling, squishing and stretching dough
- Move their bodies to music



The World Around Us

We will be encouraging the children to:

- Observe changes in the weather
- Use their senses to explore the different textures of a range of items e.g. feathers, wood, mud
- Discuss how to care for living things e.g. birds and worms
- Recognise a range of birds and describe their features



Outdoor Learning Activities (including Forest School)

We will be encouraging the children to:

- Design a bird house using loose parts
- Use binoculars to search for birds and record their findings on clipboards and iPads
- Make a clay bird
- Create a bird feeder



Learning Through Digital Play

We will be encouraging the children to:

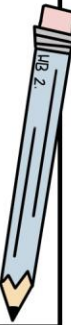
- Play turn taking games on the Interactive Whiteboard
- Click and drag numbers into their correct order
- Use the up and down arrows
